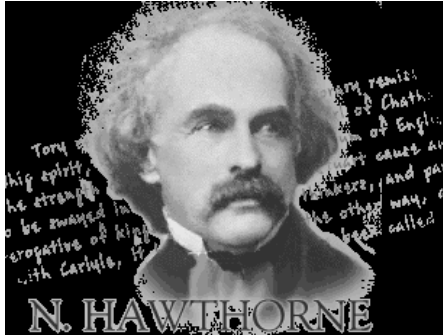


**BOSTON & BEYOND . . . Boston, Salem, Newport, Peabody & Cambridge**

While several of our tours include visits to Boston, this tour centers on Boston and the nearby areas of Salem, Peabody, Newport and Cambridge. Since all four nights will be at the same hotel there will only be one check-in and we'll see more . . . and we've upgraded the tour to one of the more beautiful times in late June to visit this historic area.

Upon our arrival in the Boston area, we'll be checking into our hotel, but not without dinner along the way. It's a local favorite and a great way to start our visit to this area. We'll be touring Newport, Rhode Island, with our guide, and visiting both Rosecliff Mansion (one of Newport's most sumptuous "cottages", also known as "The Gatsby House") and Breakers Mansion. Our dinner today will be along Newport's waterfront, at 22 Bowen's.

We have yet another fascinating day as our guide will be escorting us along the Boston Freedom Trail, taking a walk through the historic Old North Church where the lanterns were hung to signal Paul Revere for his famous midnight ride, and then passing by the Paul Revere home. You'll also be seeing Boston Common & Public Garden, Copley Square, the Old State Home, Granary Burying Ground, the site of the Boston Massacre and more. At lunch time we'll be at Quincy Market near historic Faneuil Hall. Of course we'll be visiting Cambridge with a walk in Harvard Yard as well as touring Brattle Street to view the Longfellow House (originally built in 1759). We'll visit the USS Constitution, "Old Ironsides", at the Charlestown Naval Shipyard and seeing Bunker Hill Monument before dinner in Boston.



No visit to this area would be complete without a visit to a most interesting city . . . Salem. You'll learn about this historic city, made famous by the Witchcraft Hysteria of 1692, and the Maritime History of Trade to the Orient. We'll be traveling the narrow and winding streets of Old Town and will be visiting Abbott Hall where the famous painting "Spirit of '76" is housed. Of course we'll be visiting both the Salem Witch Museum and Nathaniel Hawthorne's House of the Seven Gables before enjoying dinner at Pickering Wharf. Nine meals are included, including dining at some of the top restaurants in the region.
