With a Nutcracker theme, winter wonderland snow scene, a land of sweets and a miniature Garden Railroad, this long-standing Pittsburgh tradition is a holiday treat for all ages.

On this holiday tour you'll be dining in a beautiful restaurant with rich woodwork and years of ambience, befitting the holidays, in the historic Station Square. As day light begins to dim, we will arrive at the PPG Holiday Exhibit at Wintergarden with its ice rink that has an ice surface that is more than 2,000 sq-ft larger than the rink at New York City's Rockefeller Center. During the holiday season the rink incorporates the plaza's traditional 60-ft tree. A fountain replaces the ice in the spring.



Our last visit of the day will be at Hartwood Acres for their lighting display on the grounds of Hartwood Acres and Hartwood Mansion. This annual Pittsburgh tradition, the Eckerd Celebration of Lights at Hartwood Acres, boasts over 400 animated light displays built around a 3-1/2 mile stretch of roadway leading up to the stunning mansion at Hartwood.
