We've had many passengers travel to Nova Scotia over the past quarter century and this package has included those most popular points-of-interest for 2011.

Nova Scotia, one of the Maritime Provinces, is most picturesque, from its rocky east coast with numerous bays and coves dotted with charming fishing villages, to the beautiful south shore. Adjacent Cape Breton Island is bordered by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, the Northumberland Strait and the Atlantic Ocean. We'll also be visiting a second maritime province, New Brunswick (Nouveau-Brunswick). New Brunswick and Nova Scotia differ from each other, as you'll discover. Nova Scotia is virtually surrounded by water while New Brunswick has a large seacoast but is sheltered from the effects of the Atlantic Ocean.



- Eighteen meals are included in this package. One evening you'll even be able to order lobster if you'd like.
- Bay of Fundy, Reversing Falls in St John, Moncton. It's a natural phenomenon.
- Cape Breton Island for two nights, the summer home and museum Alexander Graham Bell, in Baddeck.
- We'll be traveling the Cabot Trail with its spectacular scenery . . . known as one of the "most beautiful drives in America". Be sure you've brought your camera since we'll possibly be seeing eagles and even a moose as we travel to Peggy's Cove, a fishing village noted as "the most photographed little town in the world".



- We'll visit Nova Scotia's largest city, Halifax, dominated by the Citadel fortress.
- Admissions are included for the Maritime Museum, which includes artifacts from the Titanic. Grand Pre Historic Park shows the history of the Acadians and commemorates the epic poem by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, "Evangeline". Our driver will be taking us through the Annapolis Valley, the most fertile farming area in the province. We'll be boarding a ferry in Digby to take us back to St John, New Brunswick.
- There will be stops along the way including a visit to Freeport, Maine, home of the famous L.L. Bean store. Passport or Passport Card needed.
